







- Map tools
 - Oluf Rygh: Norwegian Farm Names
 https://www.dokpro.uio.no/rygh_ng/rygh_form.html
 - In English
 - Look here to see if your farm existed in middle
 1800s
 - Spelling is important along with special letters

- Map tools
 - Norgeskarthttps://norgeskart.no/
 - Allows you to enter a farm name and then select "your" farm from the list
 - Generally, not useful for farms that no longer exist
 - However, some roads or places may have your farm name and exist because the farm used to be there.
 This is particularly true where the farm was swallowed by development




Map tools

- Historiske Kart
 https://www.kartverket.no/om kartverket/historie/historiske-kart
- No English Allows you to find high-resolution maps of a fylke at many times. Best farm use is about 1850-1870
- Allows you to download the PDF and then use PDF tools to zoom in or print
- Look for "kart over /fylke name/ Amt"

Map tools

- Kart.1881 https://kart.1881.no/
- Much more commercial and modern era
- Allows you to find people, streets, towns, and farms if they exist now
- Some English mostly Norwegian
- Does have a Historiske kart section for cities and towns some back to 1700
- Has high resolution btter than Google sometimes photos


- Map tools

 - U.S. only will show legal boundary changes over time for any state
 - Subscription version available at Family History Centers

- Map tools
 - Centennia
 - Shows legal entity changes for Europe over time
 - The online version is only a partial demonstration you need to download a version for good results
 - Nations edition is free 1789 1939
 - This is mainly continental Europe and focuses on Germany
 - Best to download this rather than use the online demonstration version
 - Full one which includes Norway and covers 1000 -2003, is \$90
 - Some versions can cost up to \$12,500.


- Map tools
 - Geogen http://legacy.stoepel.net/en/
 - Germany only
 - Shows where a name is clustered in most recent census
 - Very useful for finding where a German ancestor may have come from
 - Density map is at <u>Geogen (stoepel.net)</u>

- Map tools
 - MapCarta
 https://mapcarta.com/
 - Lots of ads
 - Finds many farms mostly they have to still exist
 - demonstration

- Gravminner https://slektogdata.no/gravminner
 - Works a lot like find-a-grave
 - Many people who were buried had their gravesites reused. Gravminner is starting to try and document those

 Does show headstones if photos available, even for "removed" headstones.







- <u>Deepl</u> <u>https://www.deepl.com/translator</u>
 - Deepl is a very good translator better than the free ones. But they are in business to make money. They do have extensions for Chrome and Edge which are free to download.
 - Like Google, they do have a daily and monthly limit.
 - It works just like Google Translate except they do not translate web sites
 - Mainly for businesses needing to translate documents.
 - I tend to use this for chat groups in other languages
