

Rites Set Friday For Mr. Walz

Funeral services for Benedict L. Walz, 74, Mahnomen, will be held Friday, September 11, 10 a. m., from St. Michael's Catholic church with the Rev. Fr. Justin, OSB, officiating. Rosary will be recited this evening (Thursday), 8 p. m., at the Mattson Funeral Chapel. Mr. Walz died Tuesday at his home.

Interment will be at St. Michael's Cemetery with Otto Burggraf, Gust Bjerken, Albert Noll, Bill Bruggeman, Harry Andring and Norbert Kochmann as pallbearers.

Mr. Walz was born February 22, 1890, at Paynesville, the son of the late Joseph and Mary Walz. He attended schools at Paynesville, later lived at Richmond and Albany and came to Mahnomen county with his parents in 1907. Except for one year at Callaway he has since been a county resident.

He was married to the former Elizabeth Flottemesch, October 26, 1920, at Callaway. Mr. Walz was a veteran of World War I. He had served for 12 years as a supervisor in Marsh Creek township. He was a member of St. Michael's church.

He is survived by his wife; five sons, Christopher, Louis, Aloys and Joseph, Mahnomen, and Anthony, West Fargo; five daughters, Mrs. J. E. (Catherine) Mullins, Mrs. Willys (Lucille) Rodger, and Mrs. Alvin (Theela) Hjelstad, all of Casper, Wyo., Mrs. Julius (Eleanor) Bjerken, Mahnomen, and Mrs. Howard (Florentine) Remaker, Norwalk, Calif.

Also surviving are two brothers, Tom Walz, Mahnomen, and Joseph Walz, Walker; and two sisters, Mrs. Aloys Buschette, Mahnomen, and Miss Catherine Walz, Browns Valley. Thirty grandchildren also survive. Mr. Walz was preceded in death by a son, his parents, seven brothers and four sisters.
